




HISTORY

Alligator in chambal

In the Chambal region, specifically along the Chambal River, the Gharial (Gavialis gangeticus) is the species of crocodilian most commonly associated with the area. While often referred to as an alligator due to its long, narrow snout resembling one, the gharial is actually a species of crocodilian native to the Indian subcontinent. Gharials are distinguishable by their long, thin jaws lined with interlocking teeth, which are adapted for catching fish.



They are considered critically endangered, with conservation efforts focused on protecting their habitat and breeding programs aimed at bolstering their populations.


